At Home Learning: Parent Tips

	<p>Set up a learner-friendly area Make sure your child has a well-lit place to complete homework. Keep supplies within reach.</p>
	<p>Schedule a regular study time Set a time of day for school work. Some kids work best in the morning while others may prefer the afternoon. Set a time that works for your family.</p>
	<p>Help them make a plan Encourage your child to break up the work into manageable chunks and take breaks as necessary. Create a work schedule for the day.</p>
	<p>Keep distractions to a minimum Reduce or eliminate TV, loud music, or phone calls.</p>
	<p>Make sure kids do their own work Children will learn when they think for themselves. Parents can make suggestions and help with directions.</p>
	<p>Be a motivator and monitor Ask about their school work. Give encouragement, check completed homework, and make yourself available for questions and concerns.</p>
	<p>Set a good example Does your child ever see you diligently working on something or reading a book? Be a good role model.</p>
	<p>Praise their work and efforts Praise their efforts in learning at home.</p>
	<p>Get help when needed Encourage your child to reach out to friends in their class with questions. Contact the teacher when needed.</p>
