General Information

How can I reach someone in the Transportation Department?

Our office is open at 5:30 A.M. until 5:00 P.M. to accept phone calls. Voicemail is available for after hour inquiries. Calls will be returned the next working business day.

Who is eligible for transportation?

Transportation is provided to in-district students only. School of Choice students are not eligible to receive transportation.

Who drives our buses?

Twenty-six drivers are required to cover all of the Fraser Public School routes. Three substitute drivers are available in case of illness or time off. Schools bus drivers must possess a commercial driver's license (CDL) and complete 18 hours of State training before driving a school bus with an additional 6 hours of refreshed training every other year. In addition, each driver must obtain a criminal background check and pass an annual physical. All drivers are subject to random drug and alcohol testing.

Important Transportation Procedures

Fraser Public School District is requiring a parent/guardian or designee to meet their child at their assigned bus stop/house each and every day for the following groups of children:

- ~ The student who is a kindergartener.
- ~The student who is under five years of age.
- ~The student who has special needs and requires adult assistance.

Failure of a parent/guardian or designee to meet their child as identified above at their assigned bus stop/house will result in the following action:

- ~Transportation will make every attempt to contact a parent or designated person to receive the student
- ~ Transportation will contact the students' school and report that no one is there to receive the child.
